HEAD TEACHER'S WELCOME

Welcome back everyone, I hope that you all had a lovely half term break and are refreshed and ready for all that this term has to offer.

I'm afraid I am going to start with a moan... Since September, it has become apparent that there is an increase in parents collecting their children late at the end of the school day. Whilst I appreciate occasionally a delay is unavoidable this cannot continue as it is. It is upsetting for children and negatively impacts on the staff's time. We shall now be monitoring this in the same way we do morning punctuality. Please, if you are running late contact the school office to let us know. Just to remind you Nursery-Year Two finish at 3.25 p.m. and years 3-6 finish at 3.30p.m.

In more positive news, we held our first PTFA meeting this week in school, and I am pleased to say we had some fantastic support from a number of parents/carers. Thank you all. There was plenty of ideas, enthusiasm and commitment for how we can develop this group to raise money and support the wider opportunities we can offer children and families at Paget. It was agreed that the first event will be in support of Children in Need on Friday 15th November. Children can attend school on this day in non-uniform - this year's theme is 'wear spots to raise lots.' In return, we ask the children to either bring in £1 cash donation or shop bought cakes to donate to the after-school cake sale. The PTFA will hold a cake sale in each playground at the end of the school day on Friday 15th November (see poster later in newsletter). The monies raised on this day will be split, with 50% going to Children in Need and 50% to Paget PTFA. Any parents/carers still wishing to get involved with the PTFA, we have our second meeting on Monday 11th November straight after school, please do come and join us if you're free to do so.

What's New?

Rearranged Layout: We've reconfigured the library to create designated areas for different age groups and activities. Each section is now easier to navigate, with books sorted by age group or subject matter. We have sections tailored for Nursery through to Year 6, with a variety of fiction, non-fiction and poetry books available.

Specialized Zones: Our library is now divided into dedicated zones for reading, story sessions, and group activities. These zones are designed to foster a love of reading and learning, whether it's a quiet space for independent reading, a storytelling area or a classroom area for group lessons.

- Using the library quietly and respectfully, so that others can enjoy the space.



What Religious Education at Paget during Autumn term 1 looked like

Year 1 have been understanding the concept of belonging to family, school, city, faith, culture and the world as part of their Religious Education. They have begun learning the importance of saying thank you and been introduced to the 'thank you' prayers by looking at a story where Jesus thanks God for food through the biblical story of feeding the five thousand.

Year 2 have been learning why we need rules in all parts of our society and understand that rules are given because of the love and care that the rule giver has for people. The children have begun to understand how behaviour affects our choices through the biblical story of Cain and Abel.

Year 3 have been looking at how Muslims share through Zakat and Christians share through the Harvest. Thank you to our Year 3 children for an amazing Harvest Festival assembly. Thank you also to our Paget parents, families, friends and community for being incredibly generous in donating and supporting our annual Harvest collection.



Year 4 have been learning about Diwali. Diwali is the Hindu festival of light. Diwali means "row of lights" and celebrates the story of Rama and Sita. It also marks the beginning of the Hindu New Year.

Year 5 have been considering the concept that the family unit is the fundamental basis for a caring society. They have begun to understand how Islam and Christianity promote caring and protection through the marriage process.




Year 6 have been looking into U.K. law in the context of Christian morality and becoming aware of the unfairness of prejudice and discrimination.

They are basically secret apps that are concealed by looking like a normal, less conspicuous app. For example, one of these apps looks and works like a working calculator when opened, but when a passcode is entered, it reveals photographs, videos, documents and contacts.

One way to prevent your child from using these apps is to ensure parental controls are set up so you can review all app purchases.

SPORTS REPORT 2: FOOTBALL

Hillstone versus Colebourne

Bonfire night, 5-of November 2024. With the smell of fireworks in the air, Colebourne found themselves pitted against Hillstone for the first match. Both sides played well but neither of them were better than Paget. Some said they were fierce, but Paget were fiercer.

Paget Primary versus Colebourne

Next up was Paget Primary versus Colebourne. All our players practised scoring goals and they kept hitting the spot because of the amazing players they are.

Our goalkeeper did an amazing job keeping the ball out of the net, covering the corners even though they are the hardest places to defend the ball from reaching.

I expect you are wondering about our players - they were Cameron, Zavier, Wilson, Khalil, Freddie, Behzad, Kian and last but not least Billy, our goalkeeper.

As they walked onto the pitch you could see the look of determination in our players' eyes. They seemed noticeably confident, as they knew soon, they would obliterate their competition.

In the first 5 minutes Paget scored, leaving Colebourne reeling! While Colebourne was still in shock, Paget scored yet another goal. Another step towards their incoming victory. Before Colebourne could even comprehend what had happened, Paget was in the lead by 3 goals to 0.

Sadly, one of our astonishing players, Behzad, took a shot but missed and hit the post. Paget were passing like professionals - accurate, direct passes. Paget got a corner but unfortunately no goal, even great people make mistakes.

Cameron passed to Behzad, and he scored right into the top corner. The goalkeeper stretched as far as he could, but he couldn't get a finger near the ball. Zavier got kicked, causing him to fall to the ground; his face screwed up in immense pain. But he made a comeback, rising to his feet then playing on, like nothing had happened.

Khalil swiftly passed the ball forwards, through the other teams' defence to Wilson, who courageously took a shot. Colebourne's goalkeeper caught it, denying Paget yet another goal, good for Colebourne but no good for Paget.

Zavier was tackled by the other team, their midfielders taking him down like a lion striking its prey. Freddie, seeking revenge, tackled but he fell to the ground. Colebourne tried to take a shot but Cameron, remembering how Freddie was helplessly sprawled out on the ground, headed it down to his feet and dribbled all the way to the other side of the pitch, scoring a brilliant goal. Without a pause, Freddie tackled the other team, scoring in the last thirty seconds and leading Paget to beat Colebourne 10-0 as the final whistle blew.

Paget versus Hillstone

The second game was Paget versus Hillstone. Hillstone were the first players to get a touch of the ball, they dribbled all the way to the goal taking the first chance they got to take a shot. Infuriatingly, they missed.

Billy took the goal kick and, running across the pitch Cameron took possession of the ball. He began to dribble towards the goal, where Hillstone's goalkeeper stood guard, silently. Cameron booted the ball as hard as he could but used so much force that it flew right over the net. Once the ball was back in play, Hillstone passed back and forth, until they found an opening in Paget's defence, where they took a confident shot, scoring a screamer of a goal and putting themselves into the lead.

In the centre of the pitch, Hillstone lost possession, allowing Behzad an attempt to score, but he failed. Hillstone, who were filled with rage at the number of goals that Paget had scored, ran across the pitch and took a shot, scoring themselves a magnificent goal, closing the gap.

It was 3-2 to Paget. Khalil took the ball from the centre spot, furiously running across the pitch until he reached the opponent's end. He scored a goal into the top corner, increasing the lead to 4 to 2. Hillstone, flowing with jealousy, came to tackle Freddie but accidentally kicked him, allowing him to have a penalty. He scored - Paget won 5-2.
