## Spotlight on Reading: KS2

Hi everyone,

All of KS2 are busy in their English and Reading lessons and enjoying their new books. It was great to get into Year 3 this week and listen to the children's opinions of their new book. Year 6 are busy preparing for SATs and completing lots of reading practice. Please encourage your child to read at home as often as possible.

#### Reading in Key Stage 2

In Key Stage 2 (KS2), children are taught a broad range of subjects. The reading domains, which focus on developing reading comprehension skills, are outlined in the National Curriculum. Here's a summary of these reading domains to help you understand what your child is learning:

- Word Reading: This domain focuses on a child's ability to decode words, using phonics (letters
  and sounds) to read new words. At KS2, the focus shifts to more complex vocabulary, reading
  fluency, and recognising key words that might not be easily decoded.
- 2. Comprehension: Comprehension skills are key to understanding what is read. This includes:
  - o Retrieving Information: Finding facts and details directly from the text.
  - Understanding Meaning: Interpreting the meaning of words, phrases, and sentences, and understanding figurative language like similes or metaphors.
  - Inference: Reading between the lines to make logical guesses about what is happening or what characters are feeling, based on the text.
  - Summarising: Identifying key points and summarising the main ideas of a passage or story.
  - Predicting: Using clues in the text to make predictions about what might happen next.
  - Understanding Structure: Recognising how the text is organised (e.g., chapters, headings) and how this helps to understand the story or information.
- Vocabulary: Children are encouraged to develop a rich vocabulary by learning the meanings of
  words, their usage, and their relationship to other words. This helps them not only in reading
  but also in writing and speaking.
- 4. Critical Thinking and Evaluation: At KS2, children are encouraged to evaluate texts, think critically about the author's purpose, and consider the impact of the language used. They learn to discuss the effectiveness of different texts and how well they communicate ideas.

These domains are intended to help children read confidently, with understanding, and develop a lifelong love of reading. Parents can support their child's reading by encouraging them to read regularly, discussing the books or texts they are reading, and asking questions that help them think deeply about what they have read.

# Spotlight on Reading: KS2 (Continued)

#### The Top Ten Benefits of Reading for Children

- 1. Their vocabulary is larger and more extensive.
- 2. They perform better academically.
- 3. Their imagination can run wild.
- 4. Their creativity skills develop.
- 5. They develop empathy.
- 6. They gain a deeper understanding of their world.
- 7. Their concentration levels improve.
- 8. The parent and child bond improves.
- Their cognitive development is supported.
- Their social skills and interaction improve.

#### 4. Black Country Living Museum


- · Location: Tipton Road, Dudley
