Spotlight on Safeguarding: Online Safety

Hi all,

Mr Harris here with some more online safety tips. This week I wanted to discuss the game 'Roblox'. I am aware that many children across the school play on this website.

Roblox is a platform consisting of a collection of games. Players can either create games or play games that other users have created. It is free to download (however subscription options and in game/app purchases are available) and can be played across numerous devices. A lot of the content is user generated, which may mean not all games will be suitable for your child to view/play. It is important to set up appropriate parental controls for your child.

What should I be aware of?

Chat Facility - Players can chat to each other on Roblox. You can turn communication off completely or add restrictions, such as only communicate with friends.

Virtual Currency - Players can buy Robux (their virtual currency) to buy in-game upgrades or accessories.

For children under 13, you can set the Monthly Spend Restriction in settings.

Game content – as mentioned, users create games so sometimes the content/themes may not be appropriate for your child.

How do I set up parental controls and a pin?

Parental controls are available within settings. We recommend that you explore the parental controls available and set as appropriate. You can enable a PIN, which means that changes cannot be made without this pin. You can set up Allowed Experiences, which allows you to select age-appropriate experiences, so your child can only join experiences that match their age. Age categories available are for all, 9+, 13+ and 17+. All experiences are still searchable though.

SPOTLIGHT ON CURRICULUM: P.E.

One of the many great things about Paget is how much value our community places on our children leading healthy and active lifestyles. This can be seen, in part, by how many children participate in clubs, competitions and team or individual sports (both inside and outside of school). It is always fantastic to hear about their experiences and share with them any of their highs and lows. Such as some of our district football players who were recently selected to play for the county against Leeds.

Our sporting abilities have really come to the forefront over the last few years, with national competitions and becoming winners in a variety of different competitions. As a school we have recently purchased new competition tops and jackets for the children to wear when they represent us. Creating an ethos of being proud to pull on that Paget top.

It is great seeing so many children attend our clubs at school, where some children have found their sport and have used it as a steppingstone to become involved in community clubs. Or even to help them socialise further with a range of different children outside of their class. If your child is still to find their passion in sport or you have any suggestions, I am always happy to help or listen to your ideas.

Due to sport being such a huge factor in our school, I am always looking for ways to improve the children's experiences. Recently, I asked a range of children across the school for their opinions around P.E. The feedback was generally positive, which was fantastic to hear. There were some suggestions that the children would like to see, and these will be taken into consideration as we continue to improve the delivery and impact of Physical Education within Paget.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind all parents that PE kit is part of our school uniform. The correct P.E. kit is **black** shorts (or jogging bottoms/ leggings), a **plain white** top, suitable footwear (trainers or pumps) and a **school jumper**. Some children have been coming into school wearing a hoodies. These are not part of the school P.E. kit and are very dangerous to wear in P.E. lessons. If it is cold outside, then please ensure your child is wearing their school jumper like they would any other day. Long hair should be tied up in a ponytail and all jewellery, including earrings/ studs, should be removed. Any religious jewellery (such as bracelets worn for religious reasons) should be covered with a sweat band.


SPOTLIGHT ON READING FOR PLEASURE
