# Spotlight on Safeguarding: Online Safety

Age ratings are in place to help protect your child, so we thought we'd provide you with a little reminder of how important it is to check the age ratings of what your child is accessing online. Here are the age ratings of some of the more popular apps that young people are accessing. Did you know that WhatsApp has an age rating of 16?



Whether your child is viewing films, accessing apps, playing games online, using social media or downloading other apps – check the age rating first to see if your child is old enough.

In addition, the likes of PEGI include further content descriptors, which will give you an indication of the type of content that your child might view e.g., violence, if accessing the app/game etc.

# SPOTLIGHT ON CURRICULUM: PSHE



## Spotlight on PSHE - Celebrating Difference



*This term, we are celebrating our differences in PSHE. This topic is always an enjoyable topic as we take time to get to know our school friends a little bit better. We also explore how we can deal with issues that we could face in and out of school.*

*We use the Jigsaw Programme throughout the whole school as it offers us a comprehensive, carefully thought-through scheme of work which brings consistency and progression to our children's learning in this vital curriculum area. The content we will cover this term includes:*

	<i>Content covered</i>
<i>EYFS</i>	<i>Challenges, perseverance, goal setting, overcoming obstacles, seeking help, jobs, achieving goals.</i>
<i>Year 1</i>	<i>Similarities and differences, understanding bullying and knowing how to deal with it, making new friends, celebrating the differences in everyone.</i>
<i>Year 2</i>	<i>Assumptions and stereotypes about gender, understanding bullying, standing up for self and others, making new friends, gender diversity, celebrating difference and remaining friends.</i>
<i>Year 3</i>	<i>Families and their differences, family conflict and how to manage it (child-centred), witnessing bullying and how to solve it, recognising how words can be hurtful, giving and receiving compliments.</i>
<i>Year 4</i>	<i>Challenging assumptions, judging by appearance, accepting self and Others, understanding influences, understanding bullying, problem-solving, identifying how special and unique everyone is first impressions.</i>
<i>Year 5</i>	<i>Cultural differences and how they can cause conflict, racism, rumours and name-calling, types of bullying, material wealth and happiness, enjoying and respecting other cultures.</i>
<i>Year 6</i>	<i>Perceptions of normality, understanding disability, power struggles, understanding bullying, inclusion/exclusion, differences as conflict, difference as celebration, empathy.</i>

*Each year, we revisit each topic and add to our knowledge and understanding. Lessons are pitched in an age-appropriate manner, discussing age-appropriate content. Our lessons are based on lots of discussion, which allow us all to ask questions and share the knowledge we already have.*

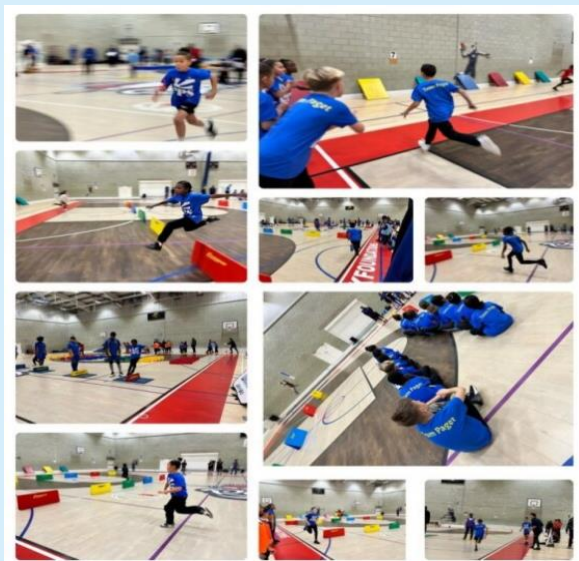
After winning and celebrating, the results were announced...AND PAGET CAME 1<sup>st</sup> PLACE!

With more information about ADHD being accessible on social media, many women are realising that they may have ADHD. Being diagnosed can be life-changing as we begin to realise that our brains work differently from neurotypical brains.
