

Which agencies does Paget Primary work with?

In our school if we feel a pupil needs more specialist help we can work with the following people to get this:

Agency or Service	Who they work with	How school can get in touch with them
Behaviour Support Service (BSS)	Children with emotional, social or mental health difficulties that impacts on their behavior.	We have an allocated worker who we contact after a parent or carer signs a referral form.
Communication and Autism Team (CAT)	<p>Children who are being assessed for or already have a diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder or communication difficulties.</p> <p>They will also provide support for families of children with these difficulties.</p>	School has an allocated worker who we will contact after we have completed a referral form and a parent or carer has signed.
Educational Psychology Service (EPS)	<p>Children or young people with complex needs.</p> <p>An Educational Psychologist will always be involved with a child who is referred for an Education, Health and Care Plan.</p>	We have an allocated worker who we contact after a parent or carer signs a referral form.
Physical Disability Service (PDS)	Children or young person with physical difficulties which impact on their access in the school setting.	School would complete a referral form with parents and send to the service.

<p>Pupil and School Support (PSS)</p>	<p>Children or young people who are working below the levels expected for their age.</p> <p>A Pupil and School Support Teacher will also work with staff in schools offering support, advice and training.</p>	<p>Pupil and School Support teachers regularly visit schools. We will let parents or carers know if they need to work with the child and get your permission first.</p>
<p>Sensory Support Service (SSS)</p>	<p>Children who have particular sensory needs such as visual or hearing difficulties where access to the usual school environment is affected.</p>	<p>Pupils are usually referred following a medical diagnosis; however we can phone them for further support and general advice for children.</p>
<p>Speech and Language Therapy Service (SALT)</p>	<p>Children with a high level speech and language difficulties.</p>	<p>We can refer you to the NHS for support by completing a referral form. We can also provide support for pupils with less complicated issues from West Midlands Independent Speech and Language Therapy Works whom we pay for as an extra service to come into Paget.</p>
<p>Family Support Worker</p>	<p>Our Family Support worker will work with the children and families with a variety of issues, including mentoring, emotional health, family support, engagement with health professionals, disability and many more.</p>	<p>We provide support for pupils and their families if appropriate with issues from our School Family Support Worker who we pay extra to come into Paget. This requires a referral form to be completed and meetings with parents to work out levels of support.</p>
<p>School Health Team</p>	<p>Children or young people with medical needs, including diagnosed allergies, epilepsy, ADHD, Autism and asthma</p>	<p>We can refer you to the School Nurse by completing a referral form and the service will meet with you to decide on which aspect of the service your child will require.</p>

Place2Be	Children and parents can be referred to this service by school. They focus on early intervention to support children with mental health issues through 1:1 counselling. This can cover a range of issues.	There is a school project manager with a team of counsellors in school for three days a week. Any member of staff or parent can request a referral. Parents are incorporated with the initial referral process.
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
